#### **Project Site Descriptions:**

#### Mystic Lakes Dam, Medford, MA

Construction of a Denil fish ladder on the reconstructed Mystic Lakes Dam has allowed access to 160 acres of river herring spawning habitat. A recent technical report on the spawning habitat in the Upper Lake is available. The site also includes a low flow channel outlet for juvenile river herring emigration and the largest eel ramp in a MA coastal river.

#### Wapping Road Dam, Jones River, Kingston, MA

Removal of the Wapping Road Dam, the second in a series of three dams on the Jones River, is underway. A fish ladder is in place at the downstream dam and a feasibility study is planned for a passage project in the headwaters great pond, at the final mainstem barrier. Long-term smelt, eel, and water chemistry monitoring is also being conducted on the River.
